



Prior to joining SpaceX in March 2010, Garrett Reisman studied economics and engineering at the University of Pennsylvania and received his Ph.D. from the California Institute of Technology in multiphase fluid mechanics. He developed satellite navigation and control systems at TRW and was selected by NASA for astronaut training in 1998. He served 2 weeks underwater in the Aquarius research habitat and first flew aboard the space shuttle Endeavour to the International Space Station in 2008. He returned on Discovery and flew again in 2010 on Atlantis. He has performed three spacewalks totaling 21 hours, got stranded on the end of the ISS robot arm for 45 minutes, has appeared on The Colbert Report and has spent a total of 107 days in space so far.
